PRESIDENT'S REPORT SEASON 2023/2024



Season 2023/24 was a year of disruption in some ways, with the introduction of the two-division system in Men's First Grade, plus the fact all teams had to train away from our home base, Stratarama Oval, due to the upgrading of our net facilities. The latter was tough on everyone with the extra travel commitments on training nights, lugging gear around to West Beach and Pulteney, separation of groups causing slight issues with communication at times, and it cost the club significantly financially, having to hire other practice facilities. I would like to commend all players, coaches and parents for their patience and resilience over the season as it was out of the norm and a credit to everyone how the club performed, despite some of the difficulties.

The good news coming into the 2024/25 season is we have brand new training facilities with better drainage, extra turf and hard wickets and an expected highquality surface. A big thankyou to the City of Holdfast Bay, in particular, for our new training facilities and helping out financially with some of the costs of hiring the West Beach facility, and I'm sure we all can't wait to get back to Glenelg and get that full club atmosphere and togetherness back.

Despite the difficulties, the club had a successful year across all areas in men's, women's and juniors, but was so close to being a wonderfully successful year! Our First Grade Men had an outstanding year making all three format Grand Finals (T20, One-day and Two-day) but unfortunately not quite getting over the line in each of them. They were the dominant team all year finishing clearly top in the red ball competition as well, so I'm sure the hurt of not quite reaching the top of the peak this season will drive this talented group to success in the near future.

We won our first Women's Premiership, so a big congratulations to the Second Grade Women's team and both Under 16 boy's teams (Red & White) who also won premierships. There were many individual highlights which are covered in this report, but I'd like to highlight a few. The Men's First Grade Captain, Jake Winter, finally got a crack at the next level playing for the Redbacks in Oneday cricket, Eleanor Larosa winning the Shelley Nitschke Medal (T20 Player of the Year) and who has come through the ranks as a junior, Conor McInerney joining the club this season and making his way back into the Redback's Sheffield Sheild Team plus several players making the Team's of the Year in First Grade (Men's: Conor McInerney and Will Bowering (also runner up in the Bradman Medal) plus Women's : Eleanor Larosa and Lucy Bowering).

We introduced a Volunteer's Day towards the end of the season as a big thankyou to all our volunteers across all aspects of the club who put in hours and hours of their time to make this great club what it is. You all do amazing work, are very much appreciated and I only heard positive comments, so this is something we will definitely continue in the future.

We welcomed two new Honorary Life Members this year, in current Fielding Coach and two-time Talbot Smith Medallist Matthew Heffernan plus Women's Senior Coach and also former player Graham Sedunary. Congratulations to both Matthew and Graham who are very deserving recipients and have spent many years contributing across several areas of the club.

A big thank you to Sam McNally, Graham Sedunary and Kym Williams and all their assistant coaches for your efforts throughout the year as well as the scorers, team managers and other volunteers that help out on a weekly basis.

Special thanks to Paul Angley who has been our secretary over the last 6 years and worked tirelessly behind the scenes keeping the club running like clockwork and will be sorely missed in that role, but I hope to see him around the place in another capacity. Paul's calmness, different perspectives and level head have been highly appreciated in several challenging situations.

Thanks to the rest of our board of management, sponsorship and fundraising team and all the other sub-committees for their work throughout the year. Thanks to major sponsors Fotobase, Gliderol and all other club and player sponsors for your continued support.

The club continues to be strong on and off the field, but we want to continue to evolve and recently had a Strategy Day, with key personnel discussing, debating and reflecting on many key aspects of the club. There were some really good ideas brought up and we hope to introduce some of those initiatives for the coming season.

Congratulations on all the great team and individual performances for season 2023/24 and we look forward to training back at home this coming season, getting back that whole club atmosphere and striving for continued success!

SECRETARY'S REPORT SEASON 2023/2024

How is success measured? The 23/24 season saw the club record 3 premierships - Women's 2nd Grade in the one-day competition and both the U16 Reds and U16 Whites in the junior grades. In addition, the 1st grade men played in 3 grand finals across the 3 formats - 2 day, 1 day and T20 and the women's 1st grade played in the T20 grand final. The men's 2nd and 3rd grades also made semifinals. In the previous season we had 6 teams play in grand finals, this year it was 7. The women's 2nd grade team showed the strength and determination of the club, entering the grand final as significant underdogs, but just working together and every member doing their part to cap off a great win.

The club had several players selected for representative teams or receive SACA rewards as detailed elsewhere in this Annual Report. Jake Winter and Eleanor Larosa both made their State Cricket debuts having commenced at Glenelg as juniors – the club is extremely proud of their achievements.

Sam McNally was the men's coach and continued the development of players and got to 3 grand finals, this is significant and shows the growth under his leadership in the last 2 years. Sam was ably supported by Craig Douglass, Nathan Schollar, Peter Gladigau, Matthew Heffernan, Tom Plant and Tim Fernandez.

Graham Sedunary led the women's coaching group supported by Jason Gentle and PJ Scott. The incredible success that Graham has achieved with the players over the last few years continued, and whilst it was not the premiership he had his eyes set on, the women's 2nd grade premiership was a fitting reward and brought a significant smile to his face. Next year it is the next level premiership?

The City of Holdfast Bay Council once again supported the club with the redevelopment of the training facilities and whilst this caused a major inconvenience for training in 23/24, we should see the benefit for several years to come. The dedicated maintenance and facilities team undertook several projects in 23/24 just to name a few – the completion of the new sight screens, installation of a chairlift, installation of new carpet in a few areas, new fridges for the bar and the operation of the new electronic scoreboard. I will have missed something significant but in addition to the yearly duties, there was painting, cleaning, reorganisation of photos and memorabilia. It is enormous the amount that has been achieved through the support of the council and the work of volunteers, in particular Alan Scholz, Bob Snewin and Brian Rowe, Bob also has an endless ability to seek out grant money to help fund so many of these projects. David Wark, the council's curator at Glenelg Oval, has done a brilliant job preparing great pitches to play on and an outfield which is first class.

In respect of the club's administration, words cannot express the dedication and love these people have for the club, I am not sure it is fully understood by the players, as a player I am sure I did not.

The Board and volunteers greatly assist me in my role. President Jarret Moyse has shown exceptional leadership, not just with the "normal" president duties, but with many other critical meetings regarding the future of the club, development of facilities at Glenelg, the future directions of SACA competitions and structures, discussion with councils, Glenelg Football club and other parties regarding the use of grounds and facilities. Cheryl Cook continues



her amazing work as Treasurer but also as an extraordinarily strong advocate for women's cricket both at Glenelg and with SACA.

Nicole Williams took on the role of Junior Coordinator at late notice but did an incredible job to bring things up to speed and I was confident in knowing that Nicole had all junior matters under control. Kym Williams, the Junior Coaching Coordinator, continued his excellent work and with 2 junior premierships, he should be immensely proud. I would also like to thank the following people for their support and the roles they undertake as part of the Board: Josh Roach as the men's players' representative, Nicole Adams as the women's player representative, Brian McFayden who not only looks after our insurances but undertakes many jobs behind the scenes, including working behind the bar. Bob Snewin for his role in sponsorship and fundraising, Ashley Capp who gives so much time and is so passionate about the club in the way he supports the club with running the bar, the bar has made a significant contribution to the financial position of the club, club hire management and many social activities and Deb Schollar who has coordinated the club's communications which has resulted in greater coordination between the various types of media used to communicate with the Glenelg 'family'. David Boschma who assists me and coordinates the maintenance works of the club.

Whilst the Board has a significant role, there are many other people who contribute and are the lifeblood of the club, who need to be thanked and who make this club great. I would like to mention the following and thank them for their support: Peter Gladigau for his work in ground allocations, cricket equipment

and many other things and his collaboration with David Wark (Council's oval curator at Glenelg) has been excellent. TREASURER'S REPORT SEASON 2023/2024

I am pleased to report on the finances of Glenelg District Cricket Club for the year ended 30th June 2024.

During the 2023/24 financial year GDCC made a loss of \$16753 after deducting depreciation of \$15754. In effect the club made a cash loss of \$999.

The main reason for the loss is the increase of costs to provide training grounds for the players. The increase in this was from \$12564 in 2022/23 to \$29736 in 2023/24. The council also paid for West Beach which I understand was about \$17,000. The excess of \$34,000 was in excess of our budget.

Income has increased by \$23429 mainly due to bar sales, subs & very active S & F Committee. SACA grants are increasing by cpi annually. Competition prize money was \$12500 for this year. Thankyou SACA for the annual funding and the assistance given to Premier Clubs, particularly Jason Herriott and James Takos for your time and understanding.

Expenses have increased by \$37449. Increase in electricity & gas, oval hire, Play HQ fees & internet have been the reason for this increase.

We sincerely thank the City of Holdfast Bay for their ongoing support and interest in our club activities as well as the upkeep of the oval and facilities.

The club continues to provide exceptional facilities and playing conditions for the players.

Capital items purchased this year include the upgrade of the auditorium, 2 new fridges and the installation of the chairlift. A loan from the City of Holdfast Bay was used to obtain these and the council are refunding the Chairlift Ioan.

The fundraising and sponsorship committee have again done a great job, led capably by Bob Snewin. Thank you to our club & bar manager, Ashley Capp, who continues to do a superb job, reflective in the increase in bar income.

Thank you to the finance subcommittee - Ashley Capp and Brian McFadyen.

Budgets set for 2024/25 are realistic and manageable. Changes being made by SACA will still have financial repercussions as we go through the year.

Lastly a big thankyou to Jarret & Paul who manage the club so well. It has been an interesting year with the perceived changes to the competition & to the oval precinct. We are very fortunate to have people of this calibre managing our club.

The club has been able to service its debts and meet all of its financial obligations throughout the financial year.

CLUB COACH'S REPORT SEASON 2023/2024



This report took me a long time to write after what was a very challenging season for our Senior Men's group. A season that promised so much for so long ultimately ended without Glenelg winning any trophies for the first time in several years. We finished 2nd in the Club Championship for the second consecutive year, but despite making Semi-Finals or better in 5 of the 6 competitions we competed in, were unable to deliver the club a premiership.

To lose the Grand Final in all three formats (Two-Day, One-Day and T20) in 1st Grade gives us a very much unwanted piece of history and was disappointing beyond words. The boys played amazingly well throughout the entire season and to walk away empty handed feels unjust. We have all learnt from this and will certainly have no shortage of motivation to be better next year.

The 2nd Grade finished top of the ladder and narrowly lost their semifinal to eventual premiers Tea Tree Gully. With a huge turnover of players from last season, this really was an excellent achievement and congratulations must go to Josh Roach as captain, who managed what was an extremely young team as well as you could imagine.

The 3rd Grade also lost in the semifinals this year, whilst the 4th Grade needed a win in the last minor round to sneak in but unfortunately lost. We are absolutely blessed to have two excellent leaders of these teams in Steven Heatley and Scott Applegarth who are fantastic role models for our youngest players. Despite the empty trophy cabinet, there were so many positives throughout the season which need to be recognised. It was particularly satisfying to see our captain Jake Winter make his debut for South Australia in the One Day Cup following incredible results in the format for Glenelg over a long period of time.

New recruit Conor McInerney had a terrific season for us, culminating in his selection in the final Sheffield Shield match of the year and resulting in him being awarded a full-time Redbacks contract for next season.

Playing Life Member, Ben Bullimore notched up his 150th 1st Grade match this season, which was a testament to his consistency over many years. He produced arguably his best performance for the club with a fighting century in the One Day Cup final and led the side well when Jake was injured.

But perhaps the success story of the season was Will Bowering, who won the Sam Starling Medal as the clubs most outstanding player. Having previously been part of the SACA pathway programs, Will had the courage to change the way he trained and prepared this season which ultimately led to his best season to date. Will finished 3rd in the Bradman Medal and took 34 wickets in the two-day competition which was a huge factor in us finishing top of the ladder. He also made his debut for the SA 2nd XI against Victoria.

At the professional level, it was thrilling to see Nathan McSweeney's stocks rise so rapidly. Captaining the Brisbane Heat to a BBL title was an amazing achievement and recently being appointed the SACA Men's Captain is an incredible honour. Nathan is the ultimate professional in every sense and we are extremely fortunate to have him represent the club when available.

Liam Scott had some untimely injuries this season which cost him games at state level but was an elite performer for us with both bat and ball. I have no doubt he is in the Redbacks best XI when fully fit. Brendan Doggett and Harry Conway both oscillated between the Redbacks and Glenelg this season, but we always welcome them into our side. The challenge for our contracted players next year is to produce match-winning performances in a final for Glenelg, which was a telling factor this season.

There are several people who I wish to thank but none more so than our tremendous coaching team. Not having access to Glenelg Oval for training this season added another layer to the difficult job that is coaching at a Premier Cricket club.

Nathan Schollar stepped up into the Senior Assistant role this season and did a great job, taking the reins when I was unavailable in the pre-season and guiding the 2nd Grade to a minorpremiership as mentioned above.

We welcomed Craig Douglass into the group as Development Coach this season and his enthusiasm and organisation created an excellent environment for our players new to senior cricket. I look forward to expanding Craig's involvement with the club next season.

Peter Gladigau continued in his role as Fast Bowling coach as well as fulfilling every job asked of him around the club. Matt Heffernan's work as our fielding coach once again made a difference on the field and thanks also to Tom Plant, Tim Fernandez and Cullen Bailey whose understated work in the background made a big impact on our results. I'd like to acknowledge all the hard work done by the many volunteers around the club which make everything run smoothly and personally thank the Board for their support during the season. Look forward to seeing you all at Glenelg in 2024/25.

Right from the first session you all turned up and did everything asked of you without complaint, especially when facilities were short of the standard we would have liked. MEN'S 1ST GRADE PLAYER'S REPORT

SEASON 2023/2024



A big season started with the new division system coming into motion. The team welcomed two new ins with Conor McInerney and Josh Pengelley. Both players had huge first grade experience with other clubs and we looked forward to seeing what they could bring for the group. The season started with T20's at Park 25. The season started strong with two comprehensive bowling performances and strong chases saw us defeat Tea Tree Gully and East Torrens. The following two weekends saw us start our one-day campaign. These two games were a massive reality check as a group as we lost to Port Adelaide and Sturt very convincingly. So, to start the season we had 2 wins, zero losses in the T20 competition and 0 wins and 2 losses in the one-day competition.

A start in the two-day format Division 1 competition saw us take on Kensington. We batted first and after a few early wickets, Conor McInerney and Liam Scott batted beautifully on a wicket that offered a bit early. Liam made 110 and saw us make 234. We then bowled well as a unit - enter Will Bowering who took the game away with a spell of 6 for 14 off 10.2 overs. This saw us bowl them out for 93, our first win against Kensington in roughly 14 years in 1st grade cricket. In the second game we took on West Torrens at home. We bowled first and stuck at the task well on a good batting wicket. We ended up bowling them out for 194, a very shared bowling effort with Josh Pengelley taking 3 wickets and Isaac Higgins with 3 also. Josh got rid of the few gun, top order batters and really opened up the innings for us to bowl them out. We then batted really well with Liam Scott and Conor McInerney, with Conor making 110 not out and Liam making 60 not out for a comprehensive 8 wicket win. The third round we played East Torrens

and bowled first. They made a strong start and were 3 for 160 before Will Bowering bowled beautifully and took 7 for 64 and we bowled East Torrens out for 216. We then started the chase strong with Conor McInerney making another brilliant 100 and he and Jake Winter got us to 2 for 198 before Conor got out and then a small collapse occurred and we lost 7 for 7 before Jake and Will Bowering guided us home for a 3-wicket win.

We then moved back into one dayers, we were scheduled to play East Torrens, but the game got rained out as well as our third T20 which was scheduled that Tuesday night. The T20 didn't get rescheduled but the one-day game did to the following Sunday after the one-day game versus Southern Districts on the Saturday following. As we had lost the first two one-day games, we needed to make sure we won both games well to ensure we made the quarter finals. In the Saturday game we took on Southern Districts and bowled first. A comprehensive bowling performance, with an excellent early innings bowling performance and then some tight bowling throughout, we restricted them to 138. Josh Pengelley bowled superbly with 4-19 off 10 overs. In reply, a swift chase ensued, with Jake Winter and Conor McInerney chasing the 138 in 14.3 overs with Jake making 89 not out and Conor making 40 not out. The Sunday game versus East Torrens started very similarly in the fact that we batted first and started the game in a positive manner with Jake and Conor putting on a huge 288 run partnership. We ended up with 403, with Jake making 182 and Conor making 130. A team bowling performance then kept East Torrens to 135 and this huge win put the team into the quarter finals finishing 5th, where we would take on Northern Districts away in January.

The final div 1 game before Christmas was played against Woodville, with week 1 of the game being rained out and turned into a one-day game. We bowled first and kept Woodville to 208 off their 50 overs, with Harry Conway the best bowler with 3 for 26. We then struggled throughout the chase to get ahead of the game but Danny Irvine held strong and led us home to a last ball victory with Danny hitting a 4 from the last ball to secure another strong win. The last games before Christmas were the T20 quarter and semi-finals days. The quarter final saw us lining up against Adelaide University, we batted first and made a strong score of 207 off our 20 overs. Liam Scott the star with 72 not out off 41 balls. We then bowled well as a team with everyone bowling well to keep them to 172 off their 20 overs. This meant we had a semi-final game in the afternoon vs Port Adelaide. We batted first again and made 167 with Jake Winter the best with the bat with 63 off 28. We then bowled excellently to keep them to 139, with Liam Scott and Will Bowering the best with the ball with 2 wickets each and advancing us into the final in January against West Torrens.

After a lovely Christmas and New Years break, we started off the new year with a 2-day Saturday and Sunday game versus Tea Tree Gully. With rain around, the first day was delayed for a large chunk of the day until the later afternoon, where we had around 2 hours to bat. On what was a green deck and offered plenty, we struggled early but enter Ben Bullimore who produced a stunning innings that night and the following day and ended on a brilliant 100 not out. We then had 30 overs to bowl them out, due to the rain affecting the number of overs, in those overs we had them 7 for 18 at one point and then they ended 8 for 35 with Liam

Scott bowling beautifully taking 6 for 6 from 10 overs. The match ended in a draw. The following week, we played Adelaide University and lost the toss and had to bowl. Another great collective bowling performance led us to bowling them out for 153 with Marcus Lee (3/17) and Will Bowering (3/30) being the best with the ball. With the bat, we chased the 153 down with ease, only losing 2 wickets in the process. Danny Irvine batted beautifully making 71. We then batted on and made 9 for 278 declared before we bowled again but only managed to get them 6/127 after the overs. Another great win which led us to a big match up vs Port Adelaide. We lost the toss and were put into bat. We started off shakily and continually lost wickets all day but a standout innings from Liam Scott, in which he scored 109, drove us to a very competitive 337. This was well supported by Josh Croom who made 55 and Damon Kerr who made 42. We then bowled superbly again after Port made a strong start and bowled them out for 159 with everyone chipping in but the stars were Pengelley and Bowering with 3 wickets each. The next game was against West Torrens, we bowled first due to a green wicket and probably bowled the worst we have all year and ended up bowling them out for 161. Feeling a little over par for the wicket that was produced. We then started off the batting innings alright being 1 down overnight and then we got to 2 for 80 and looked in a good position before we lost consistent wickets and then ended up falling 15 runs short with no real standout performers with the bat and the only standout performer with the ball was Josh Pengelley with 4 for 55.

These few two-day division 1 games were surrounded by some short form finals. First was the T20 final against West Torrens at Adelaide Oval. We were outplayed from the first ball and after they made 4 for 197, we failed to get going and were bowled out for 67. A disappointing result after a really strong performance in the T20 competition until then. The one-day competition saw us play Northern Districts in the quarter final away.

We had an incredibly strong bowling performance where we bowled ND out for 74 with Josh Pengelley and Liam Scott both taking 4 wickets each in a dominant performance. We then chased it down with relative ease, with even contributions. Our semifinal opponents were Port Adelaide and we lost the toss and had to bowl first and again we bowled beautifully as a side and ended up restricting Port to 130. With Isaac Higgins the best with the ball with 6 for 25. We then stumbled early with the bat, before Jake and Ben Bullimore guided the team home 2 down in the 30th over to put us through to a Grand Final. The grand final was a rematch from a few years ago against West Torrens. We won the toss and chose to bat first. A disappointing first 10 overs left us 4/17 at one stage and then a great fightback from Ben Bullimore and Isaac Higgins, saw us get back to a competitive score after our 50 overs with 7 for 211. Ben finished with a wonderful 112 not out. The bowling innings started very strongly and at one stage we had them 4/83 and looking strong before they got away from us and chased the score down in the 49th over. Another disappointing loss and one that we felt was very winnable.

After two tough grand final defeats, it was down to the two-day competition to resurrect our season and bring some silverware home. We finished the season strong after losing to West Torrens in the round 8 twoday game, when we faced Woodville. We batted first on a green wicket and the team batted beautifully with even contributions throughout the team and fifties from Conor McInerney, Nathan McSweeney and Isaac Higgins. We posted 324 and this was too many for Woodville who we bowled out for 170 in the last over of the game. The best with the ball was Will Bowering with 5 for 56. Our last round game came against Kensington at home and we batted first again, another game of even contributions with five players scoring over 30, saw us post 282. We then bowled brilliantly and ended up bowling Kensington out for 108 with Marcus Lee, 4 for 33 the pick of the bowlers

on the day. This saw us finish top of the Division 1 ladder to face Adelaide University in the semi-final. We lost the toss and batted first against Uni and batted excellently, we had 5 guys make over 40 and three individual scores of 90 or more led us to a score of 397. We then bowled excellently with even contributions from all bowlers including Conor McInerney taking his first A grade wicket for us and this led us to bowling them out for 217. This meant we were through to our first A grade final since the victorious 2012-13 side which featured both Danny Irvine and Ben Bullimore. The game started with us being sent in to bat on a wicket that was offering a bit. We started well at 1/30 but then wickets consistently fell either side of lunch and this led to us being bowled out for 153, well below par. After this very disappointing batting performance, we had to come out and bowl superbly on a wicket that was getting flatter. We started alright, having them 2/40 but consistent partnerships from them slowly got them over the line early on day 2 and we couldn't take any more quick wickets forcing a premature end to the game.

Ultimately this ended a season full of so much success yet no silverware. A strong effort from all of the boys all year with wonderful season performances from Conor McInerney and Will Bowering, which saw them both make the Team of the Year and Liam Scott very unlucky to miss in an injury riddled year for himself. It was a year full of hope and many contributors throughout the side, but a lack of success wasn't the overall mark we had hoped to achieve, especially after making all three finals. This will make us hungry for more success and determined to bring back all three flags back to Glenelg next year.

A quick thankyou to Sam McNally for his efforts coaching us all year and to Gary Kuchta for scoring us week in week out. Here is to a more successful 2024-25.

WOMEN'S CLUB COACH REPORT

SEASON 2023/2024



In the 2023/24 Season the club fielded teams in 1st and 2nd Grade SACA and a Premier Youth Team, plus a combined team with Brighton Cricket Club in the ATCA women's competition.

The season was one of contrasts, once again the 20/20 competitions were played in the first half of the season. The women's 1st grade finished equal top with Sturt, having a better quotient, but lower net run rate. The grand final was scheduled for Karen Rolton Oval and despite forecast of substantial rain, there was not an option to reschedule and as a result Sturt were declared the winners. It is worth noting that Sturt batted first in the majority of their games and were able to 'go for it' at the end of their innings and lift their net run rate, however, by contrast Glenelg bowled first in the majority of games, often bowling teams out and taking a slightly conservative approach to achieving the win, however this impacted on the run rate. The 2nd team struggled in the competition finishing 5th, there are many young players in the team, and they lack the physical strength to score quickly in the 20/20 format.

The one-day competition saw a complete change in fortunes with the 1st grade struggling to win games and being impacted by state selection and injury finishing 4th. The 2nd grade team were fortunate to gain the services of Caroline Ward for the one-day competition and her experience was critical to the development of the team and captaincy of Caitlin Seccafien. The team finished second in the minor round and played Northern Districts (this was their top team and included players who played 1st grade in the previous season). Glenelg made 129 from 39.1 overs

with a number of batsmen making a contribution. While the final total was short of what the team would have liked, it was runs on the board. The teams bowling and fielding was extremely good and quickly had Northern District 9/48 and whilst the last wicket took a little time to get the girls stuck to the game plan and maintained pressure to have Northern finally bowled out for 71. Once the first 4 bowlers shared the wickets and the other 2 bowlers used bowled very tightly.

The Premier Youth Girls team (U18) finished second and lost the grand final to Kensington.

The development of the women's program is highlighted by those players who are selected to play at higher levels and whilst some players have come from other clubs, it was gratifying to see some of very young homegrown talent being recognised.

His experience and coolheaded approach made the captaincy job much easier. Club Coach Sam McNally was also instrumental with identifying future talent at the club and allowing young players opportunities in higher grades. I look forward to what is going to be an exciting time for the Second-Grade team as we evolve and grow as players and leaders of the club. With similar processes and winning attitude, the ultimate success of another premiership is inevitably within reaching distance.

MEN'S 3RD GRADE CAPTAIN REPORT

SEASON 2023/2024



The 3rd grade entered the 2023/24 season as the reigning premiers and with complete confidence that it would contend for silverware again. With many of the premiership side returning to compete again, combined with some new faces coming into the senior program, expectations were understandably high for this group. After achieving the ultimate success last season, anything less than going all the way again would be a disappointment. Unfortunately, this turned out to be the case.

The season commenced with a solid performance against Port Adelaide, where the side chased down the target of 156, with Riley Hill making 70 not out. After the bye in round 2, we headed out to face Kensington in round 3 for the grand final re-match. Despite not starting brilliantly with the ball, a disciplined performance in the second half of our innings in the field, led by solid spells from Harvey Otto and Jonty Higgins, restricted them to 166. The chase did not start well with us being 4/49, but a brilliant innings of 64 not out from Bodey Hosking in partnership with Tom Worthington (49) saw the side to a comfortable fivewicket win. Round 4 saw another comprehensive performance from the team, with the returning Kevin Perera taking match figures of 7/50 as the team achieved an outright win over a young West Torrens team. This was followed up with another professional performance against East Torrens, as Kelly Angove (4/36) and captain Heatley (64) led the team to its fourth win. The season had started as well as it possibly could have, and expectations were understandably high.

Round 6 saw the team comprehensively beaten by a welldisciplined Adelaide side. This game, as disappointing as it was to be completely outplayed, served as a very good reminder that continual hard work was required to ensure the side was well positioned to compete in finals. The final round before Christmas against Woodville saw us achieve a gritty win despite not being at our best. Despite an average couple of rounds, the 3's sat on top of the ladder at the Christmas break and were well set to attack the second half of the season.

The Round 8 match against Northern Districts was abandoned due to some uncharacteristically wet January weather. We were then in a great position on multiple occasions throughout the match against Adelaide University in Round 9, however we were not able to capitalise and were well beaten in the end. The team responded brilliantly in Round 10 against Prospect, where Tom Smith led the way with 5/34, before a brilliant opening stand between Kuwerdeep Singh (67) and captain Heatley helped us run down the target of 170 with eight wickets in hand. Unfortunately, this was followed by another poor performance against Tea Tree Gully, resulting in another significant loss, despite Zac Chapman's effort with both the ball and the bat (2/95 and 50).

Against Southern Districts in Round 12, after choosing to bowl first, we had possibly our worst day in the field for the year. Multiple chances were missed and frustrations were beginning to mount. Despite this we managed to bowl them out for 183. The chase did not begin well and, at 9/148, we were staring down the barrel of dropping out of the top four. However, Alex Percy was joined by Tom Worthington, who arrived at the game halfway through the day after dragging himself off his sick bed, and together they slowly worked their way towards the target. As the runs slowly ticked down, the more nervous the boys became. With 5 runs required, Percy followed up a beautiful cover drive for four with a drop and run into the off-side to seal a one-wicket win. This was an amazing feat for the two in the middle to be a part of and was a real uplifter for the group. It was hoped that this win could spark us into action to go and achieve something special. The final home and away game against Sturt was a tough scrap that unfortunately did not go our way, despite us again having multiple chances to grab the momentum and run with it. This meant that we finished in 4th place on the ladder and set a semi-final date with Adelaide University.

After losing the toss and bowling first, we began brilliantly with the ball, with Jared Kuhl, Tom Smith, Kelly Angove and Alex Percy also bowling incredibly well. We were in a commanding position, having them 7/58 and looking like we would bat for two hours on the first day. However, a late order partnership enabled them to get to 169 all-out. Despite a positive start to the run chase on the second day, we were unable to get any sort of substantial partnership together and were bowled out for 116, therefore ending our season.

A season that began with so much potential for the 3's unfortunately ended in disappointment. Put simply, we were not good enough for long enough to warrant playing off for silverware this season. On one hand, this was a massively missed opportunity for a group who expected to be competing in the last game of the year. However, on the other hand, looking at the considerable number of players

missing from the senior squad through the second half of the year, and with the in-experienced team we had, making finals was an achievement in itself. You must be one of the final four teams to have a chance at playing off for silverware, and we are still clearly one of the stronger teams in the competition. Tom Worthington topped the batting charts for the second year running, finishing with 292 runs at an average of 36.5, while Kelly Angove finished on top of the bowling statistics with 18 wickets at 18.89.

Thank you to the club, the volunteers, the Board and the sponsors for all of your support and assistance throughout the season. It was a different season with us not having access to Glenelg Oval for training, but it was great to have everything organised and prepared to support us through this season as best as possible. To the coaching group for all of their efforts with the 3's group and the senior squad more broadly – Sam McNally, Nathan Schollar, Craig Douglass, Peter Gladigau and Matt Heffernan – your passion and energy for the club is infectious and our players are extremely fortunate to have these people involved with the senior squad.

One final acknowledgement I need to make is to the 3rd grade stalwart – Tom Worthington – who announced his retirement after the conclusion of the season. Wortho ends his career having played 101 senior games for Glenelg and finishes as a two-time premiership player and a premiership captain. Wortho has been an outstanding leader for our group over several years, providing a great level of experience and mentorship for our group. We congratulate Tom on all he has achieved at the Glenelg District Cricket Club and wish him, his wife Kristen and young Ralph all the very best – the door to our changeroom is always open, mate!

I hope that everyone has an enjoyable off-season, rests, and recovers well after a long and challenging season. Looking forward to preparing well and attacking season 2024/25 to compete for more trophies.



U18 SHIELD REPORT SEASON 2023/2024



After underperforming last season, the U18 squad was keen to make amends in 23/24. We only had 4 top age players available, so we selected a young squad of 15 players to represent the club this season. Traditionally, to make finals in this competition, teams need to win 4 of their 5 minor round matches, so this was the target that we set ourselves before the tournament.

We started the competition by playing Southern at Glenelg. We had Southern in trouble at 6/88 but they were able to post 226 on the back of an excellent hundred by their number 7. We lost wickets steadily until Jonty Higgins (40) and Leroy Hagon (37) got us back in the game with a 61 run partnership, but it wasn't enough and we lost the match by 18 runs.

Needing to beat Sturt at Price Memorial, captain Jack Thomas led from the front winning the toss and making a magnificent 91 on a difficult pitch. Jack was ably assisted by Lachlan Douglass (35) in a 94 run partnership to get us to a total of 186 all out off 49.1 overs. Our bowling and fielding unit then easily accounted for Sturt, bowling them out for 106 off 36 overs with Rahul Evuri 3/10 and Michael Jansson 3/24 the leading wicket takers, with all bowlers bowling well and backed up by an excellent performance in the field.

We comfortably accounted for Prospect at Broadview Oval. We won the toss and fielded bowling Prospect out for 96 off 39.2 overs, again with contributions from all bowlers with Jonty Higgins the standout with 4/16 off 9 overs. We went out to get the runs as quickly as possible and lost a few wickets along the way but got the runs in the 22nd over 5 wickets down, Jonty completing a great match with 40no.

Our fourth and final match for week 1 was against Kensington at Camden Oval, Kensington had also had a good week, so this was going to be a great test for the lads, which was made more difficult when Jack had to be replaced just before the toss due to injury. Kensington batted first keeping wickets in hand throughout their innings to finish on 8/181 after their 50 overs. This was another exceptional performance from our bowling and fielding group who came together after a tired start and a blast from the coaches at the 17 over drinks break. We chased the runs down in the 44th over with 5 wickets in hand. Our batting innings was defined by 2 partnerships; an 82 run 3rd wicket partnership between Jayden Prior (48) and Ryan Sharma (29) and an unbroken 5th wicket partnership of 53 to finish the chase between Logan Banyer (31no) and Lachlan Douglass (18no).

On Monday, we travelled out to the Paddocks to play Northern Districts, needing to win to secure our place in the finals. Northern batted first limping to 10/107 off 41 overs. As was the case for the entire tournament, our bowling group performed well, with Alex Percy the standout with 3/14 off 9 overs. Also, as was the case in all matches, we went out to get the runs as quickly as possible, knocking the runs off in the 20th over. We welcomed Kuwerdeep Singh into the team after missing week 1 due to SACA U17 selection, with 46no.

Tuesday was the Semifinal at Glenelg Oval and this was to be the highlight of the tournament for us. Kensington batted first and got away from us, getting to 3/152 after 30 overs. The team stuck to their task and fought back to bowl Kensington out for 246 after 48 overs. Higgo again the standout with 3/46 off his 10. This also gave us some momentum going into our batting innings. Jack and Kuwerdeep opened and set the tone brilliantly with a 100 run opening partnership in just 16 overs. We then lost 4 quick wickets, but Kuwerdeep Singh (107no) and Logan Banyer (39) finished the job off with us finishing on 6/247 off 43.1 overs. This was a great knock by Kuwerdeep who batted brilliantly in the early overs with Jack, taking advantage of the fielding restrictions, and he then had to steady the ship, forming another partnership after the loss of 4 wickets with Logan. Game 3: One-Dayer against West Torrens at home, they batted first – Josh's 4 for, Jarah and Rahul's 2fers got them all out for 93. 37 not out from Rahul and quick fire 21 from Tait got us through for only 3 wickets down.

Game 4: Two-Dayer against Woodville at home, won the toss, batted first scored 258/4, with Ethan's 93(deserved a 100) and Tait's 62 and Jack's 41. Roy, Jack, and Ethan chipped in with 2 wickets each, and Blake Meakes took 3 wickets to have Woodville all out for 182. We batted again, ended up scoring 4/75 with Harry scoring a solid 23 no off 36 balls.

Game 5: One-Dayer against Port Adelaide away, won the toss, batted first, scored 156/1 on the back of Rahul's fantastic 100, then got them all out for 71 with Rahul snapping getting 4 wickets.

Game 6: One-Dayer against Tea Tree Gully at home, won the toss, batted first made 179/3 on the back of another Rahul 100 and fantastic 50 from Ethan. Roy and Rahul's 2 wickets restricted them to 157/6.

Game 7: One-Dayer against Kensington away, won the toss again and batted first, made 169/7. Jarrah's 3 wickets, Roy and Ethan's 2 wickets got them all out for 149. Very close game, they needed 23 off 30 balls with 5 wickets in hand, Roy's two wickets in 2 balls, and then Jarrah's burst got us through. BIG STRAIGHT SIX from Roy was the highlight for me.

With his 4/13 in the Semifinal against Woodville and a gutsy 30 in the Grand Final, coupled with 2 crucial wickets, Player of the Finals is Curtis Alsop. An absolute leader on and off the field. Well done, Curtis.

Batting Award - Well, there are not a lot of things this lad can't do on a cricket field. There was a point in the season where he was so much in command of his batting that he could forward defend a good length ball 3 times, then when he got bored, he'd time the same length ball for a six. He hit 3 hundreds during the course of the season, but my favourite innings of his was 94 against Sturt in the last game before finals where we chased down 190 odd. Batting award is Ratna Rahul Reddy Evuri's.

Bowling Award –Rahul often turned up as bowler-in-chief as well, taking crucial wickets in the middle overs, breaking partnerships when we needed them the most. Stellar season, for taking 20 wickets @ an average of 16, well done. Well done, Rahul.

Seahorse Medalist U16 Reds – As I said before, there are not a lot of things this lad can't do, makes runs for fun, and takes wickets when the team needs them. Bigger and better things are in the offing for him if he keeps working hard. Would love to follow his journey and see where it lands him. Seahorse Medalist for U16 Reds is Ratna Rahul Reddy Evuri.

All in all, almost a perfect season with improvements seen across the

board, in all facets of the game as well as personal development of the lads. They showcased the true Glenelg spirit and will go a long way in setting them up for Senior Cricket future with the club. I am truly privileged to have seen this improvement and being a small part in this development process.

We were fortunate enough to be given the opportunity of competing in the pilot season of U17 cricket in 2023/24. The Premier Junior clubs were spilt into 2 divisions to compete in 5 minor round matches with a Grand Final to be played between the 2 teams that finished highest in the 2 draws. Matches were played as 50 over one-day-games, with all 50 over rules applying and were played on Sundays, allowing us to select all Saturday players, whether they be playing junior or senior cricket for Glenelg or First 11 school cricket. This made for a strong competition which was great for the development of our players.

We started very well beating Southern by 167 runs. Batting first, new captain Kuwerdeep Singh and vice-captain Jayden Prior put on an opening stand of 125, with Jay making 59 and Kuwerdeep 91 on debut as captain. Logan Banyer 31 and Lachlan Douglass 49no finished off their work to end our innings at 6/280 after our 50 overs. Our bowlers then made short work of Southern, bowling them out for 113 in 32 overs with Rahul Evuri taking 3/23 off his 10 and Ethan Williams 3/35 off 7 overs.

We then beat Adelaide by 69 runs, which looks more comfortable

than it was. In trouble at 7/101 we eventually made 9/185 off our 50 overs due to some brilliant tail order batting from number 9 Leroy Hagon making 36 and 17no from Roy Rana at 10 and 17no from Jude Pope at 11. Leroy then ripped Adelaide's top order apart taking 5/30 from 9 overs to bowl them out for 116.

This resulted in us playing a super over which we lost by 1 run, which was a disappointing way to end the pilot season.

Whilst we may not have performed as well as we may have expected, the U17 competition is a great initiative and the experience gained by the 18 players who were selected was invaluable for their development. This also provided a great introduction to the U18 Shield (also played in 50 over format) which many of the U17 players went on to play in successfully this season.

The batting was won by Kuwerdeep Singh with 152 runs at 30.4. The bowling was won by Rahul Evuri with 10 wickets at 9.0 and the fielding was won by ever-reliable Logan Banyer.

A huge thanks to Raj Rana and Darren Banyer for coaching the team with me, to Kym Williams for his help in getting everything set up, and to the parents for their support and help at trainings and on match days.
